Container	Materials	Materials not allowed	This is what happens to your waste
1	COMBUSTIBLE fine crush Beach balls, books/binders, construction plastic, Styrofoam, CDs, rubber, LPs, paper bags, plastic bags, foam plastic, hose, garbage bags, vinyl flooring, wet room wallpaper.	No tarpaulins, textiles, tyres, or glass fibre reinforced plastic.	Re-sorted, crushed, and used as fuel in district heating plants.
2	WOOD Boards, demolition timber, doors, kitchen fittings, Masonite, chipboards, hardwood flooring, wooden furniture (including painted).	Pressure-treated wood is placed in a special container.	Chipped and used as fuel in district heating plants.
3	CORRUGATED CARDBOARD Only corrugated cardboard.	No milk cartons! Empty cartons of plastic and Styrofoam.	The paper fibres are dissolved and used for one of the layers in new corrugated cardboard.
4	METAL Bicycles, strollers, aluminium, stainless steel, steel pipe furniture, sheet metal.	No washing machines, refrigerators, drying cabinets, or the like.	Fragmented, then the iron goes directly to the ironworks. Other metal goes to a large separation plant and is then sold as raw material.
5	MINERAL WOOL, PORCELAIN, CERAMICS Fibreglass wool, stone wool, crystal, heat-treated glass, sinks, toilet seats.	NOTE! Hagby has a special container for sinks and toilet seats.	Re-sorted and deposited in decomposition cells.
6	MIXED PAPER Forms, brochures, note pads, office papers, envelopes, binders, pocket books, post-its, magazines, waxy or plastic paper.	No paper or plastic bags!	The paper pulp is dissolved in water and the black ink is washed out. The pulp is used to make new paper for newspapers.
8 8.1	ELECTRONICS Light fixtures, drills, table lamps, computers, vacuum cleaners, electric radiators, microwaves, mobile phones, radios (8). TVs and monitors (8.1).	No fixed installations such as a boiler. Ask the staff!	Collected by an authorised company for disassembly, recycling, and destruction of hazardous materials/substances.
10 11	REFRIGERATOR/FREEZER, APPLIANCES Refrigerators, freezers, air source heat pumps (10). Dish washers, range hoods, cooktops, hobs, tumble dryers, washing machines (11).		The above applies to appliances as well! Refrigerators and freezers are ground down and the Freon is sucked out. The Freon is destroyed and the metal is refined into raw material.
17	PRESSURE-TREATED Patio decks, fences, floor decking.	Pressure-treated wood is classified as hazardous waste.	Only smaller quantities are accepted at recycling centres (max. 3 m3). Larger quantities will be referred to Löt. Not included in the business punch-ticket. Stored and chipped at Löt – then to combustion.
22	RUGS & UPHOLSTERED FURNITURE coarse crush Curtains, golf bags, fibreglass plastic, sheets, mattresses, rugs/seat cushions, stuffed animals, soft bags, tarpaulins, spring beds, skis, sails, tents, surfboards, roof boxes.	Cassette tapes, VHS tapes, roll films are placed in the red bag rack (not available at Löt).	Coarsely crushed and used as fuel in district heating plants.
23	GYPSUM Plasterboards.	Only pure gypsum!	Ground into new gypsum powder.
25	HARD PLASTIC Crates, flower boxes, flower pots, mailboxes, trays, CD cases, cans, hangers, buckets, helmets, houseware, toys (non-electric), mouldings, plastic drums, plastic furniture, plastic pallets, sleds, waste containers, drain pipes/gutters, toilet seat covers, magazine holders, laundry baskets.	Place PVC plastic (pipes) in No. 22! Ask the staff!	Washed, sorted, and recycled into new plastic materials.
27	TEXTILES AND SHOES Clothes, shoes, hats, tablecloths, curtains, blankets, other textiles.		Sorted for second hand, relief supplies, and fibre recycling.
28	WINDOWS (with or without frames) Glass panels, mirror glass, car windows, shower walls, drinking glasses and bowls, laminated and tempered glass.		Crushed at Löt. The glass is recycled as new glass packaging (frames are chipped and used as fuel, blinds are recycled as metal).

Remember!

ALWAYS empty bags and packaging before recycling them.

Elektronics / Companies

Companies may leave electronics with producer's liability free of charge in the equivalent quantities that are normally left by households at recycling centres. Larger quantities and other electronics are accepted by Hagby Recycling Plant for a fee.

Stop!

Materials not allowed at the recycling centres

Ammunition and explosives (police), dead animals and risky waste (ask your municipality), medicines, excl. cytostatic medicine (pharmacy), radioactive materials (Swedish Radiation Protection Authority), food/household waste (ordinary waste collection).

Container	Materials	This is what happens to your waste
12	PACKAGING All types of empty paper, plastic, glass, and metal packaging, as well as newspapers.	Visit ftiab.se for more information on packaging.
13 26	STONE, SOIL, CONCRETE Tile, roof tiles, asphalt, bricks. NOTE! Hagby has a special section 26 Pure concrete.	Used as construction materials at SÖRAB's plants. Pure concrete is recycled into new concrete.
14	TYRES FROM PASSENGER CARS (Passenger car) tyres with or without rims. Max. 8 tyres per visit.	Passenger car tyres with or without rims are sent for recycling. The rubber is used for re-treading or energy recovery.
15	HAZARDOUS WASTE Adhesives, spray cans, insecticides, nail polish, paint, batteries, solvents, drain cleaners, car batteries, oil, and paint residues.	Chemicals are sent for destruction. Metal is recovered from Ni, Pb, and Cd batteries. Large lead batteries are turned into raw material for new batteries. Acid is removed from car batteries while plastic and lead are recycled. Lithium batteries are handled separately (fire hazard).
16	LIGHT SOURCES Fluorescent lamps, light bulbs, low energy bulbs.	All collected light sources are crushed in a closed system. The quicksilver is dealt with and the glass, metals, and plastic are recycled. Light bulb powder can be recycled into new fluorescent tubes and low energy bulbs.
18 19	GARDEN WASTE Leaves, brushwood, grass cuttings, sawdust, fruit. Tree stumps are accepted at Löt.	Most of the garden waste deteriorates and becomes biogas, the rest is composted and becomes soil. Branches and twigs are chipped and sold as fuel to heating plants with solid fuel boilers.
21	ASBESTOS Asbestos slates, etc. Larger quantities are accepted at Löt.	Deposited in special cells. NOTE! Only single goods (max. 3 kg, must be packaged with tape and marked "ASBESTOS") of asbestos will be accepted at our recycling centres.
24	REUSE AND CLOTHES COLLECTION The aid organisation Human Bridge provides bins for collection of textiles and shoes at our recycling centres. Stockholm City Mission collects furniture for reuse, Myrorna takes care of the houseware, and bicycles are collected by Easy ReCycling.	Clothes and furniture are resold in the shops of the respective organisation and the surplus is donated for charitable purposes. Hagby also has a Pantamera Express machine where you can recycle your aluminium cans and PET bottles (not glass!).
